EASTER WEDNESDAY


Confraternity of the Penitence of the Most Holy Christ of Health and Our Lady of the Utmost Consolation.

Easter is one of the most interesting attractions of Motril. Easter in Andalusia is not simply a religious event, these rituals are an integral part of our folklore, and it is no exaggeration to say that our culture cannot be understood without this intense period when the faithful contemplate the Passion of Christ, the last days on earth of the Son of God.




The date is different every year: Easter Sunday must be the first Sunday after the spring equinox, never before 22 March and never after 25 April. Easter week begins on Palm Sunday, marking Christ's entry into Jerusalem, and ends a week later, on Easter Sunday, with the procession of the Resurrected Christ.

The visual impact of these rituals is undeniable, with the silhouette of the pointed hoods and elaborate combs worn by people in the processions, and the figures of the different images reflected by thousands of candles in streets and façades under the attentive gaze of local people, many believers and sightseers. Spectacular thrones made of hardwood and precious metals and laden with flowers, embroidery and candelabras: the crafts of the guilds and brotherhoods, popular art in its purest form, are carried through the street.









Take a tour of the city's main churches and religious sites, confraternities and brotherhoods. This wonderful and exciting experience, combining artistic heritage and picturesque local traditions, is led by a professional guide and assisted by an English and/or French interpreter.

Attend a procession, where the participants will be placed on the official route (for an afternoon-to-evening procession), to be followed by a tasting of traditional Andalusian Easter pastries, handmade in Motril.

DURATION: Two and a half to three hours.

DIFFICULTY: Very low. The route is fully accessible, inclu-

ding for people with physical disabilities.

MINIMUM GROUP: 25 people.
